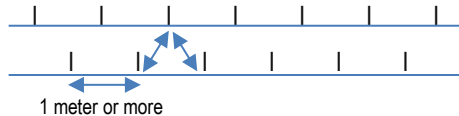

Covid Safety in Church. Some of the rules we have been following in recent months to help keep people safe in our places of worship are now being changed according to guidance from the Government.

We still need to observe social distancing, but the safe distance to be maintained has

been reduced to 1 meter (just over 3 feet). This means we can remove the barriers closing off some of the pews in our churches. You will now notice pieces of coloured tape placed at intervals along the tops of the pews:



These marks are to help you keep 1m from other persons/household groups in the church. **You will be 1 meter or more** (indicated by the double-headed arrows in the diagram) **from your nearest neighbour if there is the same amount of space between you and them as there is between any of the marks.**

If you sit directly behind the person in front of you, you will be a little less than a meter from him or her, so this is to be avoided.

All this means we can increase the capacity of the churches to approx. 100 persons (Fraserburgh) or approx. 90 persons (Peterhead), which means that, in practice, everyone who wants to come to Mass on a Sunday will be able to.

We are asking you to continue to use the Eventbrite booking system for Sunday Masses, if possible, because this is very helpful for the purpose of contact tracing, which we are still obliged to keep in mind. Please continue to sign in to Weekday Masses, or give your name to the stewards on Sundays.

Other safety procedures should continue to be observed:

- The use of face masks while in church, unless exempt

- Use of hand sanitiser immediately on arriving in the church
