The old form of the Roman Rife is often called the "Latin Mass", but Latin is in fact the official language of the Roman Church, and is still used in many places in the present, post-Vatican II form of the Liturgy. It is not the use of Latin, but the use of the older form of the Liturgy that our Holy Father has restricted. <i>Summorum Pontificum</i> granted wide ranging permissions to priests to celebrate Mass, the Sacraments, and the Liturgy of the Hours (or Divine Office, as it is also known) in the 1962, preconciliar form.
