The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, which we observe this weekend, is one of the most important celebrations of Mary in the Church's year.

Pope Pius XII solemnly declared in 1950 that "the Immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul into heavenly glory" (MD 44).

A few years later, the Second Vatican Council took up the same theme: "The Immaculate Virgin, preserved free from all stain of original sin, was taken up body and soul into heavenly glory when her earthly life was over, and exalted by the Lord as Queen over all things, that she might be the more St. Mary's 64 St Peter Street Peterhead AB42 1QB

fully conformed to her Son, the Lord of lords and conqueror of sin and death" (LG 59).



Mary's Assumption highlights her close connection with Jesus, our Saviour, and **strengthens** our hope of heavenly glory. What God accomplished for His Immaculate Mother we hope one day will, in some degree, be realised for us too: heavenly glory, not just in soul, but also in body; being with God and with all the Angels and Saints in the perfect happiness of Heaven!

Although she is now in Heaven, Mary is paradoxically even closer to us her children than she was during her life on earth. Perfectly united with God and full of heavenly power, she hears the prayers of all who turn to her and constantly intercedes for them, unfolding God's grace in their lives, and helping them with all the tenderness of the most loving of mothers towards their heavenly homeland.

Let us stay close to her. As St. Bonaventure is reported to have taught: All the Saints loved Mary, and great Saints loved her greatly.
