#### **Easter Services**

During the Easter Octave, Mass will be preceded by the Divine Mercy chaplet and novena prayer.

On Divine Mercy Sunday itself there will be the usual devotions and holy hour at 3pm – which this year will take place in **St. Mary's Church, Peterhead**.

**Divine Mercy Sunday.** It's worth reminding ourselves about the great gift of the Octave Day of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday, which is next Sunday, 27th April.

Divine Mercy Sunday is the great "Feast" of Divine Mercy. It is a day on which the Lord dispenses astonishing graces to those who trust Him and believe His message. To all who, on or as near to this day as they can, "go to Confession and receive Holy Communion" the Lord promises to "grant a complete pardon" (Diary of Divine Mercy 1109).

This is more than a plenary indulgence: it is more like baptism in its ability to take away all that a soul might owe to divine justice.

It is a grace that reveals the unmeasurable love and generosity of our Lord, and the great power of the victory of the Crucified One. Let us stay close to Jesus during this week – like Mary Magdalene or the Apostles, or like Mary the Mother of the Lord – and ask Him to prepare our hearts for such a great grace.

## "Resurrexit, Sicut Dixit!"

These Latin words appear in the famous Marian antiphon, Regina Caeli laetare ("Queen of Heaven, rejoice!"), typically sung in churches of the Latin Rite in the Easter season.

Resurrexit, sicut dixit! – He rose, as He said He would!

Jesus had foretold not only His Passion and Death, but also His glorious Resurrection. But here as in other instances, His disciples were "slow" (cf. Luke 24:25) to believe and grasp all that He said. Certainly, from a human point of view, the Crucifixion must have looked like a complete defeat.

But the tremendous suffering and human degradation of the Incarnate Word on the cross becomes a demonstration of the depths and power of His love at the Resurrection. He suffered all that... for love... and now He is risen to show us that He really is the Messiah, the Son of the living God, the triumphant victor over sin and death.

Resurrexit, sicut dixit! Jesus keeps His promises!

There's a practical lesson in this: **We should never allow our trust and confidence in God to waver.** It reminds me of what St. Faustina wrote in her Diary: "Eternal God... look kindly upon us and increase Your mercy in us, that in difficult moments we might not despair, nor become despondent, but with great confidence submit ourselves to Your Holy Will, which is Love and Mercy itself."
