Magnifica Humanitas. Pope Leo released [his first encyclical letter](#) a few weeks ago on 15th May. It's

first words are: "**Humanity**, created by God in all its grandeur..."

The encyclical looks at a specific aspect of the Church's social doctrine: "Safeguarding the human person in the time of artificial intelligence".

For a fairly lengthy document on the Church's social teaching, it's surprisingly readable – or, if you wish, dipable: read a little bit each day. You can also listen to it free as an audiobook on <https://www.vaticannews.va/en/>

Pope Leo shows himself to be an excellent teacher. After a helpful summary of some of the key documents or papal teachings that have contributed to the development of the Church's social doctrine, Pope Leo reminds us of the key elements of this teaching: the common good; the universal destination of goods; subsidiarity; solidarity and social justice (n. 46).

There are several calls to all people and all Christians in particular to be creative and proactive in responding to the challenges of the times:

"I am convinced that the concrete way of living out social relationships in the light of the Gospel is not established once and for all, but remains a task entrusted, from generation to generation, to the Christian community. Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the Church allows herself to be enlightened by God's word, reads the signs of the times and creatively seeks new ways for relationships between peoples and nations to become ever more conformed to the demands of the Kingdom of God.

"For this reason, I encourage all members of the Church not to be afraid of the present challenges, but to listen to one another and firmly embrace their responsibilities in building a more humane and fraternal society" (n. 91).
